
Tips for Finding Lower Cost Airfare

- Flight Prices based on ...
 - Availability and advanced purchase
 - Try to book at least 2 months in advance
 - Day of week? Time of day?
- Day/Date of Flight:
 - Flying on Tuesday, Wednesday or Saturday can be cheaper (Friday and Sunday are most expensive)
 - More expensive during the summer and holidays
- Decide if price or flexibility is more important
 - o Economy vs. Main Cabin
 - Consider change and cancellation penalties
 - o Track prices on Google Flights
- Get creative with routing!
 - Open jaw (ex. DTW to London, then Paris to DTW
 - Fly out of a different airport!
 - Chicago, Cleveland, Toronto, Windsor



Tips for Finding Lower Cost Airfare

- Look for the cheapest flight to a country/region
 - Google Flights: Click on "Explore" tab
 - Skyscanner and Momondo: Search "Detroit to Everywhere/Anywhere"
- Look into frequent flyer programs (earn benefits or \$ on flight and non-flight purchases)
 - Check out some of the <u>best US frequent flyer</u>
 <u>programs</u> (free to join!)
- Look for websites/apps with student discounts (more on that later)
- Get the most bang for your buck with <u>free stopovers</u>
 - o Iberia Airlines Layover in Madrid
 - o Turkish Airlines Layover in Istanbul
- The <u>24 hour rule</u>: full refund if you cancel within 24 hours of booking
 - Typically, you must book directly with the airline



24-Hour Risk-Free Cancellation

As part of our Customer Commitment for customers who book direct on delta.com or the Fly Delta app, Risk-Free Cancellation means that after you've purchased a qualifying eTicket, you have up to 24 hours after booking to cancel it for any reason and receive a full refund with no fees.

24-Hour Risk Free Cancellation Process

- 1. Find Your Trip or Log In, and go to My Trips
- 2. Select the trip you need to cancel
- 3. Select 'Cancel Flight' button and follow the steps
- Receive a full refund, which will be automatically issued to your original form of payment

Found Cheap Airfare? Avoiding Mistakes

- Avoid mixed carrier tickets
 - <u>Guide to Airline Alliances</u> (alliances are not considered mixed carriers)
- Be wary of booking through a third-party site
- Cheaper ≠ Better
- DIRECT ≠ NONSTOP
- Look closely at TOTAL travel times and itinerary
- Layovers
 - Make sure you have enough time to make connecting flights
 - At least 2 hours is recommended
 - The cheapest flights can have very long layovers
 - Look up layout of connecting airport
 - Factor in time for immigration/customs for certain airports



Avoiding Mistakes, continued...

- Research additional fees
 - Examples: baggage costs, seat selection, flight insurance, cost of checking in/checking luggage online vs. at the airport
- Only book your flight AFTER final program plans have been determined
- Consider bringing a credit/debit card with you that has no foreign transaction fees, in case of unexpected purchases
- Pack an extra set of clothes in carry-on in case of delays or lost luggage
 - Consider getting an AirTag for checked bags
- Check to see what food options will be on flight
- Make sure name and passport info are correct
- Read all of the fine print!



Helpful Websites, Apps, Newsletters


- Google Flights, Skyscanner, and Momondo
 - o Don't have student-specific discounts
- StudentUniverse: discounts exclusively for students
- **Hopper**: app that tells the best times to buy flights
- Going (formerly Scott's Cheap Flights): gives you email alerts when there are cheap international flights
 - How to Get the Best Deals on Flights
- Rome2Rio: discover alternative travel routes
- <u>SeatGuru</u>: really helpful for airline seat tips!











Round trip, per traveler

Passports/Visas

- Make sure passport is valid at least six months after going abroad
- Assume you need a visa
 - IC Visas Page: How to apply, application requirements, visas for international students,
 resources, FAQs
- When in doubt, contact the consulate or embassy
 - o Calling is better, but limited hours. Email responses can take a while, so plan in advance.
- Some countries offer visa on arrival, so look up costs and currencies
- Make copies/take photos/email yourself:
 - Passport and visa
 - Passport picture
 - Flight information
