There are two types of Curriculum Practical Training (CPT). Some academic programs have an internship requirement while some offer an optional course for a non-required internship. Students with an optional internship are required to enroll for the CPT course to comply with CPT requirements. Students are advised to consult with their respective schools/departments regarding specific requirements for courses and internships.
